

## CHICAGO BULLS TOUR

### **BERTO CENTER - SITE**

*550 Lake Cook Road, Deerfield*

This was the site of the first NBA training facility built by a NBA team. The Berto Center was built in 1992 and was used as the Chicago Bulls training and rehab facility until 2014.

### **ADVOCATE CENTER - TRAINING FACILITY**

*15 S. Wood Street, Chicago*

This is the current Chicago Bulls training and rehab center. It was finished in 2014, to replace the Berto Center.

### **UNITED CENTER (1994-present) - ARENA**

*1901 W. Madison Street, Chicago*

The Chicago Bulls team plays basketball here and the Chicago Bulls front office works here. This arena is shared with the Chicago Blackhawks for home games for both. This arena holds 23,500 spectators.

### **CHICAGO STADIUM (1967-1994) - ARENA**

*1800 W. Madison Street, Chicago*

The site of the Chicago Stadium, built for the Chicago Blackhawks, opened in 1929 and was demolished in 1995. The first air conditioned arena, it tended to also produce fog inside. This was the original "Madhouse on Madison". After 1967, it was also home to the Chicago Bulls. This arena held 17,317 spectators at its maximum limit.

### **INTERNATIONAL AMPHITHEATER (1966) - ARENA**

*4200 S. Halsted Street, Chicago*

Originally built to host the International Livestock Exhibition in 1934, after the Stockyards closed in 1971, it continued to host sporting events, rock concerts, circuses and religious gatherings. The Beatles performed here in 1964 and 1966. The Chicago Bulls played here during their inaugural season of 1966-67.
