## **GUARANTEED RATE FIELD (1991-present) - STADIUM**

333 W. 35th Street, Chicago

This ballpark replaced Comiskey Park in 1991 and the Chicago White Sox still play here. The Chicago White Sox front office and management also work here. This ballpark holds 40,612 spectators.

## **COMISKEY PARK (1910-1990) - SITE**

324 W. 35th Street, Chicago

This ballpark was built for the Chicago White Sox to play in by then owner Charles Comiskey. It was a steel and concrete stadium, being one of the newer types of stadiums then being built. It was home to the team for 80 years. Originally it held almost 32,000 spectators, then a record, By the time it closed, held 43,951 spectators.

## **SOUTH SIDE PARK (1900-1910) - SITE**

Pershing Road between Wentworth Avenue and Princeton Avenue, Chicago
This ballpark was on the north side of 39th Street (Pershing), between Princeton
Avenue and Wentworth Avenue. This ballpark was enlarged by Charles Comiskey so his
team could play here after moving from Minnesota. The White Sox won the crosstown
World Series against the Cubs here in 1906. Later, the Negro Baseball League played
games in this ballpark. This ballpark held 15,000 spectators.
