ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO - MUSEUM

111 S. Michigan Avenue, Chicago

This is the museum that the three visit. George Seurat's 'A Sunday's Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte' painting (with the dots) is still on display.

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE - BUILDING

141 W. Jackson Boulevard, Chicago

This is the site of the home where Cameron lived. Also, this also the site of the famous glass garage seen in the final moments of the film.

CAMERON'S HOUSE / GARAGE - SITE

370 Beech Street, Highland Park

This is the site of the home where Cameron lived. Also, this also the site of the famous glass garage seen in the final moments of the film.

CHEZ QUIS - SITE

22 Schiller Street, Chicago

This is the site of the restaurant where the three went to eat. This is where Ferris used the name "Abe Froman, Sausage King of Chicago" to obtain a reservation. Currently this site is a private residence.

DALEY PLAZA - SITE

50 W. Washington Street, Chicago

This is the site of Daley Plaza, from a scene with the parade.

FEDERAL PLAZA - SITE

Adams Street & Dearborn Street, Chicago

This is the site of Federal Plaza, from a scene with the parade.

GLENCOE BEACH - BEACH

Glencoe Beach, Glencoe

This is the site of the beach the three visit after Cameron freaks out.

PARKING GARAGE - GARAGE

172 W. Madison Street, Chicago

This is the site of the parking garage where Ferris took to park Cameron's dad's Porsche. Also where the parking attendants worked who took the car out for "a spin".

MR. ROONEY'S HIGH SCHOOL - SCHOOL

2300 Shermer Road, Northbrook

This is the site of the high school Ferris took the day off from. It is also the school that Mr. Rooney runs. The stairs at the front door where Ferris picks up Sloane dressed as her father are now the Sheely Center for Performing Arts entry stairs.

WILLIS TOWER - BUILDING

233 S. Wacker Drive, Chicago

This is the site of the skyscraper the three of them visited. It was called the Sears Tower back then. Today it is spelled W-I-L-I-S, but it is pronounced Sears.

WRIGLEY FIELD - STADIUM
